

Translating the Standard: BS 8901, Sustainable Events Management System

BSi 8901 is designed to help you to incorporate sustainability into your work in the events industry. It is not a simple pass or fail, but a framework for continual improvement. It is a system for implementing a process to work in a sustainable way, not for creating a sustainable event. The standard can be used by event organisers, venues, suppliers and contractors

In simple terms sustainability is: **Finding the best balance between environmental, social and economic considerations**

Environment = includes recycling, water and energy usage and pollution

Social = consideration of the benefits and impacts on staff, customers, visitors and the local community

Economic = benefits and impacts on the event/company budget and the effects on the wider economic community

Phase	Description	Actions	Notes
Phase 1	Planning	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Identify and compile sustainability Objectives (policy) 	A list of sustainability objectives with management support.
		<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Stakeholder engagement 	Communicate the policy to all those involved in or affected by your part in the event and ask for input. As a result of this you may need to re-evaluate your objectives. (ongoing process)
		<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Set targets 	Using objectives, set targets that can be measured or assessed (KPI's)
Phase 2	Implementation	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Provide resources including personnel 	Make budget, equipment, manpower and training available to meet your objectives. Operating procedures should reflect this process.
		<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Manage supply chains and maintain communications 	Encourage suppliers to conform to BSi 8901 and provide ongoing communication and support to assist in achieving this.
		<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Document the system 	Keep records of the process and the steps taken
Phase 3	Evaluation	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Monitor, evaluate 	Check that management systems (including supply chain) and process are in line with your objectives
		<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Review and learn from 	Analyse results and adjust future targets and management system accordingly.

Claiming compliance (or getting the badge)

Organisations can self-certify or be verified by a certification body (to be appointed). Wording that can be used is found in section 4 of the standard. To remain compliant year on year, organisations should demonstrate measurable progress against maturity matrix. The maturity matrix attached is a useful tool for charting the progress and highlighting position in it.
